"Don't bother, it is too much; you are too little, your wings will burn; your beak is too tiny; it's only a drop; you can't put out this fire."

And, as the animals stood around disparaging the little bird's efforts, the hummingbird noticed how hopeless and forlorn they all looked.

Then one of the animals shouted out and called out to the hummingbird in a mocking voice, "What do you think you are doing?"

And the humming bird, without wasting time or losing a beat, looked back and said, "I am doing what I can."

Let's all do what we can to care of God's beautiful world.
